


to strengthen the technical representation. He try to create depth using repetitive patterns of objects and different multiple perspective in his drawings.



Her Works resemble the imprints of nature and living. By using pen and acrylic as medium she depicts a lot of feelings about the world outside.


















Richa Arya

She noticed the women around her juggling household chores with sewing — a skill that began out of necessity when clothing was expensive. Over time, that skill became gender as feminine — and in her community, a mark of a good wife and mother. Dismissing this to be her fate, Richa embarked on her quest to be an artist.



She sculpts everyday objects using stereotypically 'feminine' skills like stitching to highlight the lives of common women — hinting at their hardships by using rusted metal sheets.






The Unique style to cast paper and make it connected with the inner thoughts makes his works exemplary.


